Fair brings together community groups, music & photography

Natick, MA— Natick's *Oldtown Community Fall Fair* will be held on Sunday, October 5 from 11 AM – 3 PM at John Eliot Memorial Hall, 40 Eliot St. (Route 16) In Natick.

With new events added each year, the Fair has grown increasingly popular. This year, local band *Suburban Child*, as well as talented local musician *Italo DeMasi*, will perform under the tent outside the exhibition hall (inside the Montessori School gym if it's raining). The community is invited to buy lunch, relax and enjoy the music. Inside, the fair hosts the third ***Oldtown Photo Calendar Competition***, which attracted a record number of visitors in 2007. Community groups, including the **Natick Historical Society**, **The Center for Arts in Natick (TCAN)**, the **Natick Community Organic Farm**, **Broadmoor Wildlife Sanctuary**, **Natick Walks**, the **West Virginia Work Camp**, the **Eliot Church**, **South Natick Neighbors & Newcomers**, the **Eliot Montessori School**, the **Natick Service Council**, and others will be on hand to meet visitors.

"The Oldtown Fair is a fun community-building event that fits perfectly with our mission," said Jennifer Hance, Executive Director of the Natick Historical Society. *"We had a great experience, and had an opportunity to meet with a large number of members and visitors."*

About the Calendar

Last year, 30 photographers entered the **Oldtown Photo Calendar Competition** and almost 200 visitors came vote for their favorite photographs to be included in Oldtown Calendar. The **Oldtown Calendar** provides a platform for passionate local photographers, and seeks to build a sense of community and appreciation for the history of the area.

About the Musicians

Suburban Child will play a collection of late 20th and early 21st century music. The musicians include founders Steve Wilson on keyboards and Mike Collins on drums, rounded out by Dick Stoner on rhythm guitar and Tom Gutermuth on lead guitar. Suburban Child renditions of many classic tunes have a track record of inspiring cheering fans! Talented lifelong musician *Italo DeMasi* has played his Midi Accordion before large groups across Massachusetts, and will offer up a number of favorite tunes at the fair.
